The Kentucky Chapter – American College of Cardiology will be celebrating its annual Continuing Medical Education Meeting on October 22, 2011. The title of the scientific program will be "Surgical Versus Transcatheter Approach in the Treatment of Cardiac Valve Regurgitation". It will include discussion about the new percutaneous cardiac valves that are available. Our target audience will be cardiologists, echocardiographers, surgeons, interventional cardiologists, physicians, and other health care providers. The program will take place at University of Kentucky in the new Albert B. Chandler Hospital Auditorium. A total of 5.5 *AMA PRA category 1 credit(s)*TM will be offered. There will also be CEU available. The projected overall attendance is between 100-150 persons.

This scientific meeting will include local and invited faculty including the President of the American College of Cardiology, Dr. David Holmes. It will be a unique program, as it will deal with surgery versus catheter-based therapy for pathologic regurgitation of each of the four cardiac valves. We have invited distinguished speakers and experts in the field including Dr. Pedro J. del Nido who is the chairman of the Department of Cardiac Surgery at Children's Hospital Boston, Harvard Medical School. The other invited surgeon is Dr. Douglas Johnston from Cleveland Clinic. We have also invited two prominent and internationally known interventionalists, Dr. Ziyad M Hijazi, who is director of the Rush Center for Congenital and Structural Heart Disease in Chicago and Dr. Ted Feldman, director of the Cardiac Catheterization Laboratory at Evanston Northwestern Hospital in Illinois. Other guest speakers include Dr. Ivan Salgo and the President of the American College of Cardiology Dr. David Holmes. Dr. Holmes will be speaking on left atrial appendage occlusion. In addition we have 11 local faculty who will participate in lectures and chairing this meeting.

We have invited fellows-in-training from the University of Kentucky and the University of Louisville to participate in poster presentations regarding their research. A Young Investigator Award will be presented for the top poster. In this meeting, we will honor Dr. Jacqueline Noonan who is well known for Noonan Syndrome. She will receive the Honorable Maestra Award.

This program has been reviewed by leaders in our field and has been rated as outstanding in content and faculty. The speakers will cover the future in cardiology in regards to the new cardiac devices in the treatment of mitral, aortic and pulmonary regurgitation.

Program Overview

The Kentucky Chapter – American College of Cardiology (KY-ACC) annual meeting is an opportunity for cardiovascular healthcare providers in the area to join together for an annual update. The meeting covers topics relevant to many in cardiovascular medicine. Topics include established and new therapeutic modalities in the treatment of Cardiac Valve regurgitation as well as the indications for intervention. Invited faculty includes researchers and clinicians who have developed new therapeutic techniques that will improve patients' outcome.

Overall Goal Statement

The goal of this program is to provide information about the surgical vs transcatheter therapeutic approach in the treatment of pathologic regurgitation of each of the four cardiac valves.

Overall Learning Objectives

- Recognize the MRI methods for quantification of pulmonary regurgitation and evaluation of anatomy of the right ventricular outflow tract
- State the implications of MRI data in decision making for surgical and transcatheter approaches to pulmonary regurgitation
- Discuss current percutaneous options for therapy regarding mitral regurgitation
- Describe indications for surgery for asymptomatic aortic insufficiency
- Discuss the current application of echocardiography, including 3D imaging, in pre- and postoperative assessment and management of mitral regurgitation
- Discuss the problems of 2D aortic root & leaflet measurements for surgical planning
- Discuss how 3DTEE can be used to assess the aortic root and leaflets
- Educate the Audience about indications for pulmonary valve replacement
- Discuss technical aspects of percutaneous pulmonary valve replacement
- Review mechanisms of tricuspid regurgitation
- Demonstrate echocardiographic evaluation of tricuspid regurgitation
- Review the indications for surgical repair of patients with Tricuspid Regurgitation
- Review the indications for surgery of patients with Mitral Regurgitation
- Review indications for surgical repair, surgical techniques and outcomes in patients with Aortic Insufficiency
- Review indications for surgery and outcomes in patients with Pulmonary Regurgitation
- Describe potential advantages of left atrial appendage occlusion transition from Fellowship to group practice
- Indicate Fellows consideration for hospital "employment" practice models
- Describe the role of an academic cardiologist.

This program is designed for physicians or other practitioners in the field of cardiology with an emphasis on current practice trends within cardiovascular medicine.

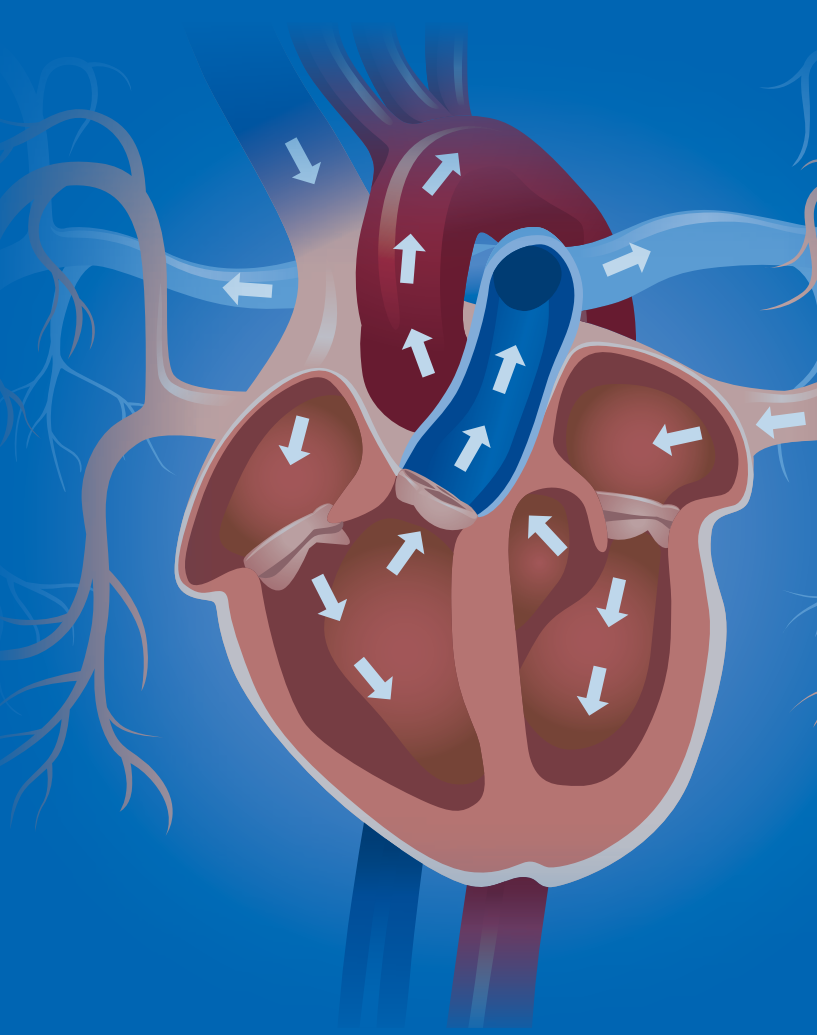
